Before the 1812 war, France and Britain were at war with each other. The Americans did not want to get involved in the war, but they wanted to continue to trade with these nations if possible. Unfortunately, relations with Britain continue to suffer as skirmishes broke out with Indians in the Western region. As Indians allied with the British and British Navy continued to intervene with American ships, war seemed inevitable. Here are some things you should know about the questions about the 1812 APUSH War that you should be preparing to answer. What was the War of 1812? The 1812 war between the United States and Great Britain included battles from Canada to the Western Region and Florida. Impressed by American sailors, America, among other things, wanted to protect its sailors from entering the British Navy. By war, the Americans hoped to put an end to the influence of American sailors and the seizure of American merchant ships; stop fighting between Americans and Indians in the Western Territory; seize British possession in Canada and the Northwest; and redeem Florida from Spain, one of Britain's allies. When did that happen? Although it is called the 1812 War, tensions escalated many years before that. Finally, Congress officially declared war on Great Britain on 18 May. The war ended in December 1814 with the signing of the Ghent Treaty. However, it took some time for the news to spread. Thus, the Battle of New Orleans took place in January 1815. Why is the 1812 war important? The war of 1812 is important because it reinforced American feelings of nationalism. The war created a unified alliance as they worked together to defeat the enemy. It also encouraged economic independence, industrial growth in America and the creation of a strong national army and navy. Henry Clay spoke of his support for the war. He was also one of the delegations sent to negotiate the terms of the Ghent agreement. Andrew Jackson- Andrew Jackson led the force during the 1812 war. He quickly became a war hero after winning the Battle of Orleans. Francis Scott Key - During the Fort McHenry attack, Francis Scott Key wrote the Star Spangled Banner, the national anthem of the United States. Federalists, made up mainly of New England traders, the federalists opposed the war. They wanted to do business with Britain. At the Hartford meeting, there was talk of resigning from James Madison of the United States as president James Madison called on Congress to declare war on the British. William Henry Harrison – As governor of the Indiana Territory, he led troops against the Confederacy of India at the Battle of Tippecanoe. Tecumseh and the Prophet Shawnee tribes, Tecumseh and his brother (known as the Prophet) worked to unite different tribes against American settlers. The Prophet Lost Tippecanoe, and Tecumseh joined the British battle of the Thames and died in battle. Events Embargo Act, December 1807 - As the British-French War rages on, President Thomas Jefferson adopts an embargo to end trade between both nations. This comes after the British Navy fired on an American Chesapeake ship and seized four sailors. The embargo law hurt the U.S. economy because most of the trade took place with the two nations. Battle of Tippecanoe, fall 1811 – Governor William Henry Harrison led troops against the Confederacy of all Native American tribes west of Mississippi. The Americans won, putting pressure on many Indians to seek help from the British. Battle of the Thames, autumn 1813 - The Americans re-invaded Detroit, and Tecumseh was killed in battle. Fighting in Washington in August 1814 - British troops descend on the Chesapeake Bay and march on Washington. They burned down several public buildings, including the Capitol and the White House, on April 24. Battle at Fort McHenry; September 13, 1814 - Fort McHenry, based in Baltimore, endures 25 hours of bombing from the British. In the freezing of the flag, it inspired a poem by Francis Scott Key. Ghent Agreement; December 25, 1814 - Delegates gather in Ghent to discuss the terms of ending the war. Both sides agreed to restore the land taken during the war and end the fighting. Hartford Convention; December 15, 1814 to December 5, 1814 They were angry at the war and wanted to leave the Union. This only angered the rest of the country and ultimately dispelled the Federalist Party. An attack on New Orleans. January 8, 1815 – Unaware of the treaty, British troops invade New Orleans but lose to Andrew Jackson's troops. War 1812 APUSH Training questions 1.
